Well equipped laboratories for department of Science, LanguageLab, CommerceandManagement faculity with facility of browsing internet. 16 LCD projectors for laboratories are available for ICT based pratical sessions as well teaching. Major-minor equipments purchased are recorded in the stockregister of each department and E-waste mechanism.

To ensure continuous electric supply for laboratories and research equippments 63KV generator installed, Fire extinguishers, 32CCTV in the campus and 14CCTV are installed in girls hostel to continuous monitoring.
