THE CONTEXT:

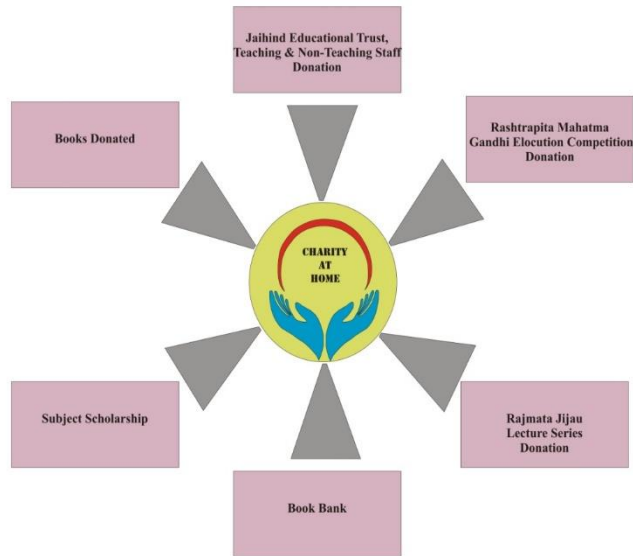
The main focus of the college is students from various economic backgrounds and villages of Khandesh region. Most of the students in the college are the wards of farmers, laborers, manual laborers. Jai Hind Educational Trust, teachers and non-teaching staff have been extending a helping hand since 2014 to ensure that students from economically backward sections should not get deprived of education. Financial support is given through various committees and University such as Student welfare and Assistant Committee, Alumini Association, Honorable Principle Late M.Y.Vaidya has sponsored scholarship to the needy students .Lecture Series like Rajmata Jijau and

Rashtrapita Mahatma Gandhi have been financially strengthened by the donors. The library provides Book Bank facility to the students to facilitate learning.

The institute always provides opportunities to the students to work under Earn and Learn scheme of the university to get financial support. It also provides financial support to economically deprived students through Financial Assistance scheme of the Student Development Department of the university.

THE PRACTICE:

Alumni Association has given fund of ₹ 58955 for the 2018-19, ₹ 64765 for 2019-20, ₹ 65,095 for 2020-21, ₹ 69275 for 2021-22 and ₹ 86990 for 2022-23 to the economically deprived students. The Student Welfare and Assistance Committee has provided ₹ 41,500 to 42 students for 2018-19, ₹ 63,100 to 66 students for 2019-20, ₹ 93,800 to 138 students for 2020-21, ₹ 47,000 to 47 students for 2021-22 and ₹ 58,000 to 58 students for 2022-23. Through Student Development Department ₹ 1,91,500 to 57 students for 2018-19, ₹ 2,76,500 to 57 students for 2019-20, for 2020-21 no financial support due to COVID-19, for 2021-22, ₹ 2,49,000 to 61 students, ₹ 2,83,500 to 63 students for 2022-23. Under the Earn and Learn scheme for 2018-19, 43 students benefited with ₹273720 from the university and ₹185760 from the college, 57 students received ₹ 5,28,840 from the university and ₹ 1,76,280 from the college for 2019-20, no funding available for the students due to COVID-19 in 2020-21. However, for 2021-22, 61 students funded by the university with ₹ 1, 48,005 and ₹ 49,335 by the college, for 2022-23 73 students funded with ₹ 4, 60,290 by the university and ₹ 1, 53,430 by the college.

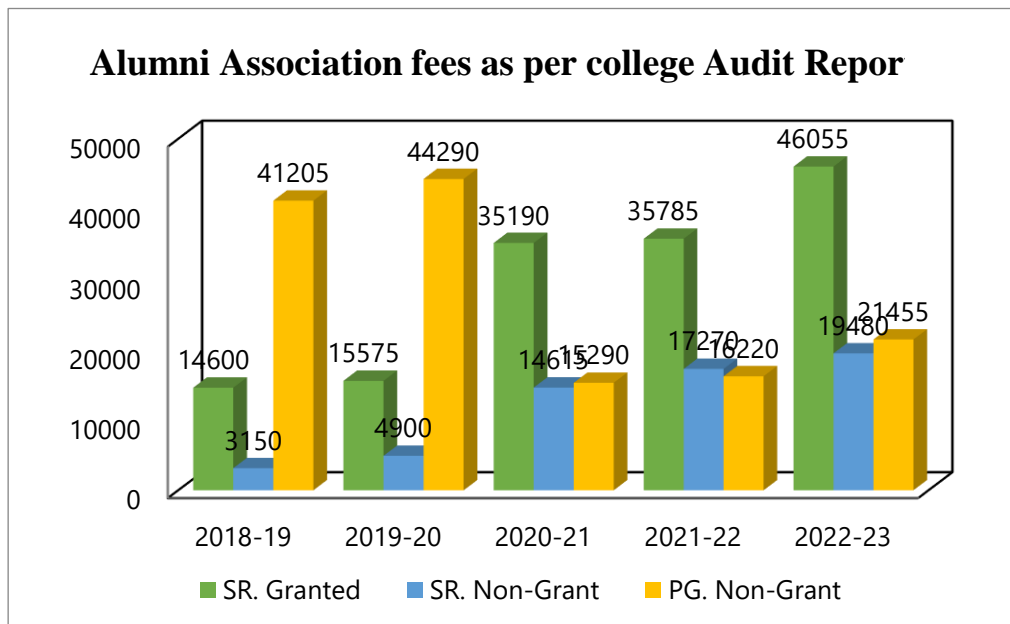


Figure 1: Financial assistance to students by alumni association.

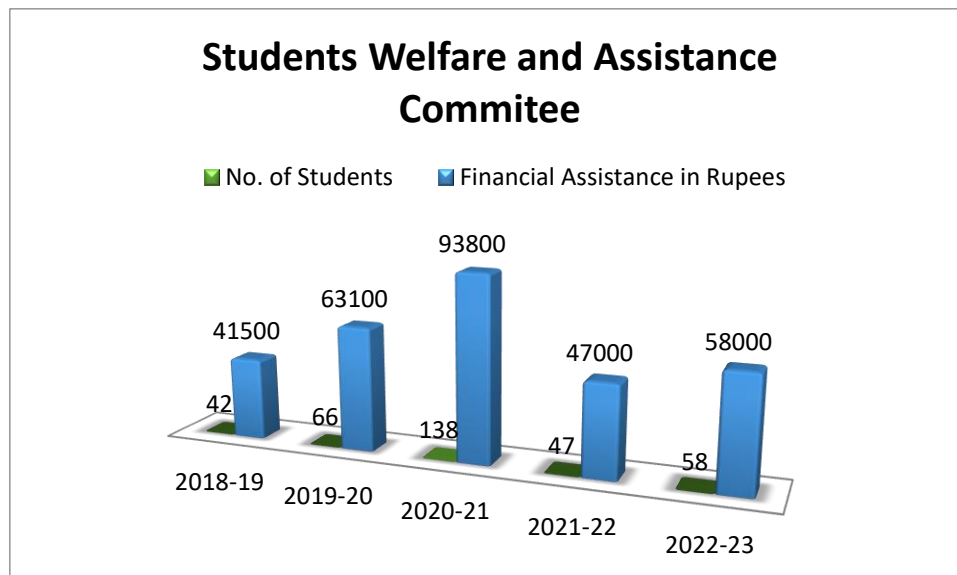


Figure 2: Financial assistance through student welfare and assistance committee.

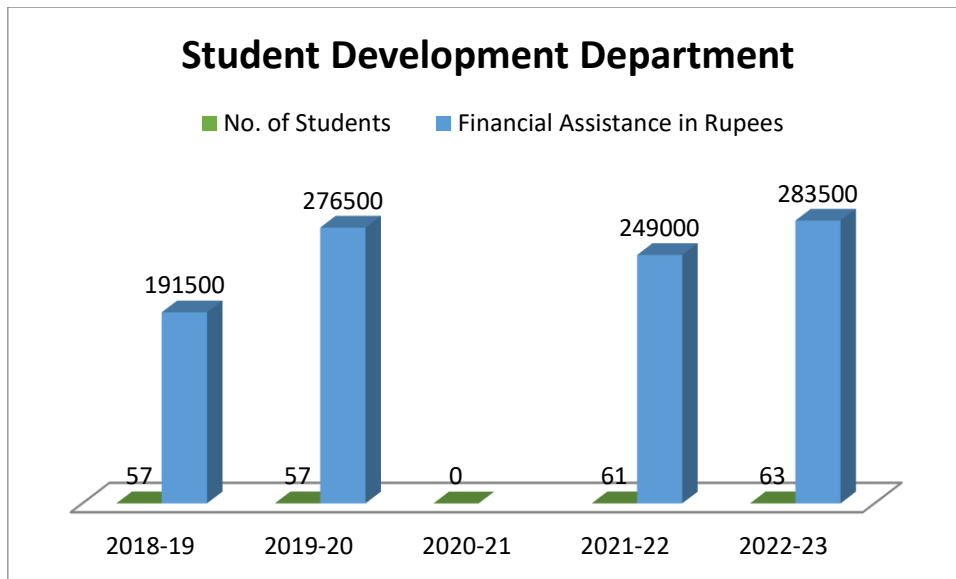


Figure 3: Financial assistance to students by student development department.

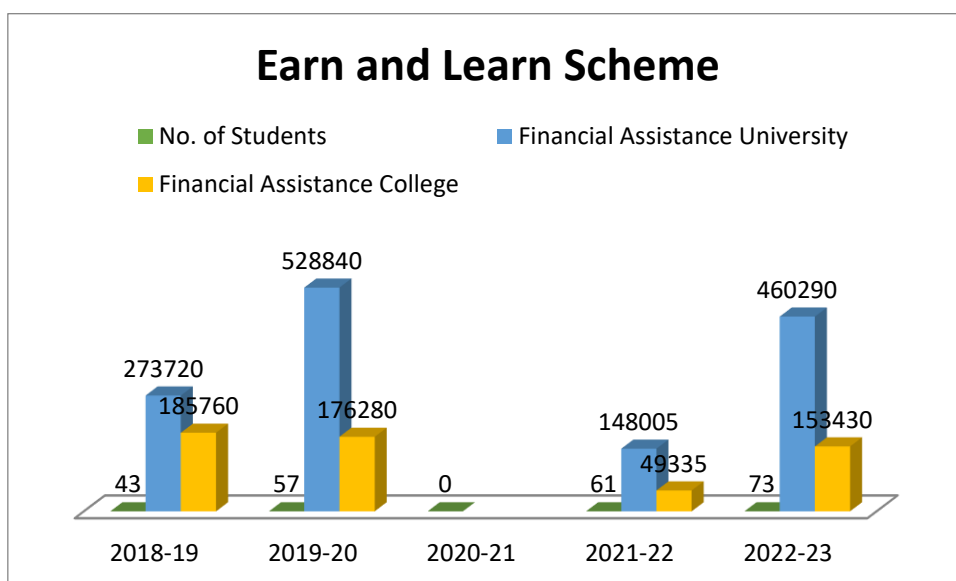


Figure 4: Financial assistance to students through earn and learn scheme.

- v. To inform them about the laws for women.
- vi. To guide the girl students about the misconceptions about the parameters of the patriarchal system.
- vii. To train in self-defencing in enhance.
- viii. To prepare the girl students future -ready.

THE CONTEXT:

Education is an essential instrument to bring social revolution and create gender equality. Education is seen as a key tool for creating gender equality. The society that treats women and men as equals is safe and healthy. The institute is playing a pivotal in promoting gender equality as a human right. The institute is working to strengthen girls students through Yuvati Sabha, Internal Women Grievance Redressal Committee ,Co-curricular activities, Lectures, Poster

Exhibition, Damini Squad programs to create safe and healthy environment. Along with the activities of the college, the faculty members of the college are engaged in delivering lectures, projects working in and for self- help groups.

THE PRACTICE:

In the academic years from 2018 to 2023 the institute has organised various programmes to create gender awareness. Yuvati Sabha has organised lectures on health, law, Judo-Karate training and banking procedure for safety of girl students. The teachers of the institute have delivered lectures on gender equality, human rights, and personality development. These lectures boosted the moral and morale of the girl students. The minor research project was conducted on the Mental Health of Women in Dhule District . Some faculty members have been awarded Ph.D in the topics like “ Gender construction in the selected novels of Margaret Atwood”, “ Portrayal of Women in Asha Bage’s Narrative Literature A Study” The department of the college run various certificate courses in Gender Studies and Study of Tribal Women. Girl students are encouraged to participate in the Avishkar, Abhirup Yuva Sansad, NSS, NCC ,Sports and cultural activities.

Internal complaints Committee and Damini Pathak actively counsel and guide the girl students. One faculty member has been working the self-help group. The institution provides hostel facility to girl students of college. Health check-up organised for the hostel girl students of the college. Birth Anniversary of the social reformers and educationalists like Mahatma Phule and Savitribai Phule, Bahinabai Chaudhari is celebrated to motivate empower the girl students and to recognize their contribution to the upliftment and empowerment of women. Health check-up camps are arranged for all students. Lectures are delivered on physical and Mental Health.

Evidence of success:

- i) No single case of sexual harassment has registered.
- ii) Gender equality allows students, regardless of their discrimination, to have access to quality and equitable education.

- iii) The institute has won credibility of the parents so the number of girl students is creasing day by day and at present 65% girl students have been admitted in the institute.

- v) The girl students working confidently in various fields due to personality development.
- vi) Students are trained for self-safety.
